Dear Members and Friends

This year, the SPCA Montérégie celebrates 35 years of compassion and dedication to animals in need. Reflecting on our humble beginnings in 1989, when \$39,000 was raised through a grassroots door-to-door campaign by a group of citizens, it's remarkable to see how far we've come. At that time, the Montérégie region was a place where animal suffering was often overlooked, with cruel practices like gas asphyxiation and the use of decompression chambers to dispose of unwanted animals being all too common.

Since its founding, the SPCA Montérégie has become a beacon of hope for animals in need across a vast territory, from Sorel to the American border, and from the southern bank of the Saint Lawrence River to the Eastern Townships. We are proud to have been pioneers in Quebec, introducing mandatory sterilization before adoption and establishing a no-kill shelter, firmly rejecting the systematic euthanasia of healthy animals to control their population.

Each year, close to 1,000 abandoned animals find refuge with us. Beyond providing shelter, we ensure they receive comprehensive veterinary care, are placed in foster homes for the most vulnerable, and receive long-term support through our Sponsorship Program. Our ultimate goal is to find them loving homes where they can flourish as cherished family members. Additionally, we see community education on animal welfare practices as an essential priority.

Our commitment to rescues and interventions has been unwavering. From rescuing mistreated horses and farm animals in Saint-Jacques-le-Mineur with the help of the Sûreté du Québec, to saving breeding dogs left without food for eight days in Saint-Mathieu-de-Laprairie, and freeing thirty dogs chained in La Présentation in temperatures of -30 degrees Celsius – these instances represent just a fraction of our efforts. Moreover, in collaboration with SPA Estrie, we seized 120 sick dogs from a home in Saint-Albert-de-Warwick. Who could forget Mouff, finally freed after fourteen years chained to a doghouse in Iberville, or Miraka, a 16-year-old Morgan mare abandoned and confined in a windowless stall for two years?

For 35 years, our passion has guided us on this journey, touching the lives of over 40,000 animals. However, our mission is far from complete. The specter of animal abuse and neglect reminds us of the critical role each of us plays in building a compassionate society. Together, let's continue to make a significant difference in the lives of these vulnerable beings who rely on us for their survival and well-being.






Charlie, Hope and Charlotte

BARBOUILLE



SOPHIA


